<b>Brief Scope of Work</b> (60 words maximum): This grant will fund development and implementation of a youth camping program at Temescal Gateway Park. The program will be for family groups with leadership and coordination provided by Anahuak. The camping programs will feature the interpretation of the natural and cultural resources of Santa Monica Bay Watershed, as well as stories, hands-on demonstration and outdoor living and survival skills. Matching funds will support the training of Anahuak volunteers in Leave No Trace and other interpretive activities that they will then use in the camping programs. Food and transportation will be funded by other sources.									
<b>Funding Source Applied for:</b>		Proposition 84, Santa Monica Bay Watershed							
<b>Narrative/Project Description:</b>  For the purposes of this grant, interpretation includes any visitor serving amenities that educate and communicate the significance and value of natural, historical, and cultural resources of the Santa Monica Bay Watershed, and increases the understanding and enjoyment of these resources. These amenities include interpretive signage and materials, naturalist led programs, special seminars and events in parkland owned or managed by the Santa Monica Mountains Conservancy.  Temescal Canyon lends itself to camping programs for first time campers. In addition to being close to the city and accessible by public transportation, the site is semi-developed, with bathrooms and the permanent storage area will allow camping supplies to be left on site and easily available for each group as it comes in. Having the overnight experience, camping under the stars, allows participants in the									

camping program to have an extended interpretive experience, much beyond the day hike. It also allows them to experience the mountains at different times of day and night, and allows program staff to introduce new skills (I,e, building a campfire, setting up a tent) that they do not have time for on a typical day program.

The specific scope of services that will be provided, include:

Program development, including materials, schedules, staff and volunteer selection and training (trainers will be funded by matching sources), parent meetings, and participant recruitment will occur in the first three months after this grant is approved.

Monthly campouts during which up to 35 participants will receive guided interpretive programs, including program development and implementation, directly relating to the watershed's rich natural, cultural and historic resources. Programming will focus on interpretation of the site's endangered species, ecology, importance of the watershed, conservation, biodiversity, Mediterranean ecosystems, wildlife corridors, and fire ecology. In addition Anahuak staff and volunteers will lead participants in Leave No Trace and basic camping skills classes, such as knots and outdoor cooking.

Supplies and equipment necessary to produce quality interpretive programs including props, maps, and audio visual equipment for projection at nighttime events.
