Funding Source Applied for:

Narrative/Project Description:

For the purposes of this grant, interpretation includes any visitor serving amenities that educate and communicate the significance and value of natural, historical, and cultural resources of the Los Angeles River Watershed, and increases the understanding and enjoyment of these resources. These amenities include interpretive signage and materials, naturalist led programs, special seminars and events in parkland owned or managed by the Santa Monica Mountains Conservancy. A partial listing of properties is attached. Special attention will be given to development and implementation of programs at new parks, most notably Vista Hermosa.

All programs will target regional audiences from our city's most impacted and disadvantaged urban areas. The specific scope of services that will be provided, include:

Guided interpretive programs, including program development and implementation, directly relating to the watershed's rich natural, cultural and historic resources. Programming will focus on interpretation of the site's endangered species, ecology, importance of the watershed, conservation, biodiversity, Mediterranean ecosystems, wildlife corridors, and fire ecology;

Partial funding of an interpretive newsletter, "Symbiosis" which is printed quarterly and is available at all park locations, distributed to park visitors by staff and is utilized as part of interpretive programming;

Interpretive materials, including site specific materials, program schedules, safety information and self guided interpretative materials that are designed and implemented to increase visitors enjoyment and understanding of the watershed;

Camping programs for disadvantaged youth ensuring that they enjoy the access to parklands and participate in guided interpretive programs that include the watershed's rich natural, cultural, and historic resources. Programming will focus on interpretation of the site's endangered species, ecology, importance of the watershed, conservation, biodiversity, Mediterranean ecosystems, wildlife corridors, and fire ecology.

Junior Ranger programs for youth designed to increase the understanding and enjoyment of the Los Angeles River. Programs will be held at Marsh Street Park, the Los Angeles River Center and Gardens and pocket parks managed by the MRCA along the Los Angeles River. In addition to endangered species, ecology, importance of the watershed, conservation, biodiversity, Mediterranean ecosystems, wildlife corridors, and fire ecology, the River Ranger program focuses on identification of plants and animals of the Los Angeles River Watershed, water ecology and stewardship;

Continued operation of monthly Transit to Trails Program for families from disadvantaged communities to parklands owned and managed by the MRCA in the watershed and participation in interpretive programs at those parks. Food and transportation funds for this program are provided by a separate funding source;

Development and implementation of an interpretive program for high school students in which the students will learn about the Los Angeles River watershed's rich natural, cultural and historic resources including endangered species, ecology, conservation, biodiversity, Mediterranean ecosystems, wildlife corridors, and fire ecology. The students will then lead guided interpretive programs for members of the public at the park, as defined above.
