RESOLUTION OF THE SANTA MONICA MOUNTAINS CONSERVANCY AUTHORIZING A GRANT OF PROPOSITION 1 FUNDS TO THE MOUNTAINS RECREATION AND CONSERVATION AUTHORITY FOR RESEDA PARK PROJECT PLANNING AND DESIGN, CITY OF LOS ANGELES

WHEREAS, the Santa Monica Mountains Conservancy is authorized to award grants to joint powers authorities pursuant to Section 33204.2(a) and 33204.27(a). of the Public Resources Code:

WHEREAS, the State of California has authorized an expenditure of funds from Proposition 1, the Water Quality, Supply and Infrastructure Improvement Act of 2014 to the Santa Monica Mountains Conservancy for capital outlay and local assistance multi-benefit grants for ecosystem and watershed protection and restoration projects;

WHEREAS, the Mountains Recreation and Conservation Authority has requested a grant from Proposition 1, Section 79735(a) of the Water Code in the amount of \$350,000;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 79732(a)(1) the proposed project meets the purpose of Proposition 1 to protect and increase the economic benefits arising from healthy watersheds, fishery resources, and instream flow;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 79732(a)(2) the proposed project meets the purpose of Proposition 1 to implement watershed adaptation projects in order to reduce the impacts of climate change on California's communities and ecosystems;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 79732(a)(3) the proposed project meets the purpose of Proposition 1 to restore river parkways throughout the state, including, but not limited to, projects pursuant to the California River Parkways Act of 2004 (Chapter 3.8 (commencing with Section 5750) of Division 5 of the Public Resources Code), in the Urban Streams Restoration Program established pursuant to Section 7048, and urban river greenways;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 79732(1) the proposed project meets the purpose of Proposition 1 to protect and restore aquatic, wetland, and migratory bird ecosystems, including fish and wildlife corridors and the acquisition of water rights for instream flow;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 79732(a)(9) the proposed project meets the purpose of Proposition 1 to protect and restore rural and urban watershed health to improve watershed storage capacity, forest health, protection of life and property, stormwater resource management, and greenhouse gas reduction;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 79732(1) the proposed project meets the purpose of Proposition 1 to protect and restore coastal watersheds, including, but not limited to, bays, marine estuaries, and nearshore ecosystems;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 79732(1) the proposed project meets the purpose of Proposition 1 to reduce pollution or contamination of rivers, lakes, streams, or coastal waters, prevent and remediate mercury contamination from legacy mines, and protect or restore natural system functions that contribute to water supply, water quality, or flood management;

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 79732(1) the proposed project meets the purpose of Proposition 1 to assist in the recovery of endangered, threatened, or migratory species by improving watershed health, instream flows, fish passage, coastal or inland wetland restoration, or other means, such as natural community conservation plan and habitat conservation plan implementation;

WHEREAS, the proposed project meets an objective of the California Water Action Plan for more reliable water supplies;

WHEREAS, the proposed project meets an objective of the California Water Action Plan for restoration of important species and habitat;

WHEREAS, the proposed project meets an objective of the California Water Action Plan for more resilient and sustainably managed water infrastructure;

WHEREAS, the proposed project meets the goals of reducing greenhouse gas emissions consistent with AB 32;

WHEREAS, the proposed project is consistent with the Rim of the Valley Trail Corridor Master Plan, and the San Gabriel and Los Angeles Rivers Watershed and Open Space Plan;

WHEREAS, Government Code Section 19727 provides for use of funds for the costs of construction or acquisition of capital assets. "Capital assets" includes major maintenance, reconstruction, demolition for purposes of reconstruction of facilities, and retrofitting work that is ordinarily done no more often than once every 5 to 15 years or expenditures that continue or enhance the useful life of the capital asset. "Capital assets" also include equipment with an expected useful life span of two years or more;

WHEREAS, the proposed project is consistent with the Conservancy's Strategic Objectives to implement the Rim of the Valley Trail Corridor Master Plan, implement the Los Angeles County River Master Plan, implement the San Gabriel and Los Angeles Rivers Watershed and Open Space

Plan, further cooperation with local governments in the region to secure open space and parkland, expand efforts to integrate nature into the urban environment, and expand education, public access, and resource stewardship components in a manner that best serves the public, protects habitat, and provides recreational opportunities;

WHEREAS, the proposed action is being taken subject to approval of the grant for compliance with the General Obligation Bond Law;

WHEREAS, the proposed project protects land and water resources; and

WHEREAS, the proposed action is exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA): Now

Therefore Be It Resolved, That the Santa Monica Mountains Conservancy hereby:

- 1. FINDS that the proposed project meets at least one of the purposes of Proposition 1;
- 2. FINDS that the proposed project meets at least one of the three objectives of the California Water Action Plan;
- 3. FINDS that the proposed action is consistent with the *Santa Monica Mountains Comprehensive Plan*, the *Rim of the Valley Trail Corridor Master Plan*, and the *San Gabriel and Los Angeles Rivers Watershed and Open Space Plan* as adopted by the Santa Monica Mountains Conservancy.
- 4. FINDS that the proposed action is consistent with the Conservancy's Strategic Objectives;
- 5. FINDS that the proposed projects implements the goals stated in Proposition 1;
- 6. FINDS that the proposed action is exempt from the provisions of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA);
- 7. ADOPTS the staff report and recommendations dated December 11, 2017 for this item;
- 8. ADOPTS all of the preceding whereas clauses;

- 9. AUTHORIZES a grant of Proposition 1 funds to the Mountains Recreation and Conservation Authority in the amount of \$350,000 for the Reseda Park Project Planning and Design, City of Los Angeles;
- 10. FURTHER AUTHORIZES the Chairperson to execute the grant agreement and to perform any and all acts necessary to carry out this resolution; without limiting the generality of the foregoing, such authority shall include those provisions that he or she shall determine in the exclusive exercise of his or her discretion are necessary to carry out the purposes of this resolution and to comply with the policies of the Conservancy, and to otherwise carry out the provisions of state law and regulations.
