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# MINUTES OF THE JOINT MEETING of the SANTA MONICA MOUNTAINS CONSERVANCY and the SANTA MONICA MOUNTAINS CONSERVANCY ADVISORY COMMITTEE

December 9, 2013

### 1. Call to order.

The 403<sup>rd</sup> meeting of the Santa Monica Mountains Conservancy and Santa Monica Mountains Conservancy Advisory Committee was called to order by Chairperson Irma Muñoz, at 7:30 p.m. on December 9, 2013 at Franklin Canyon Park, Beverly Hills, California.

## 2. Roll Call of Conservancy.
